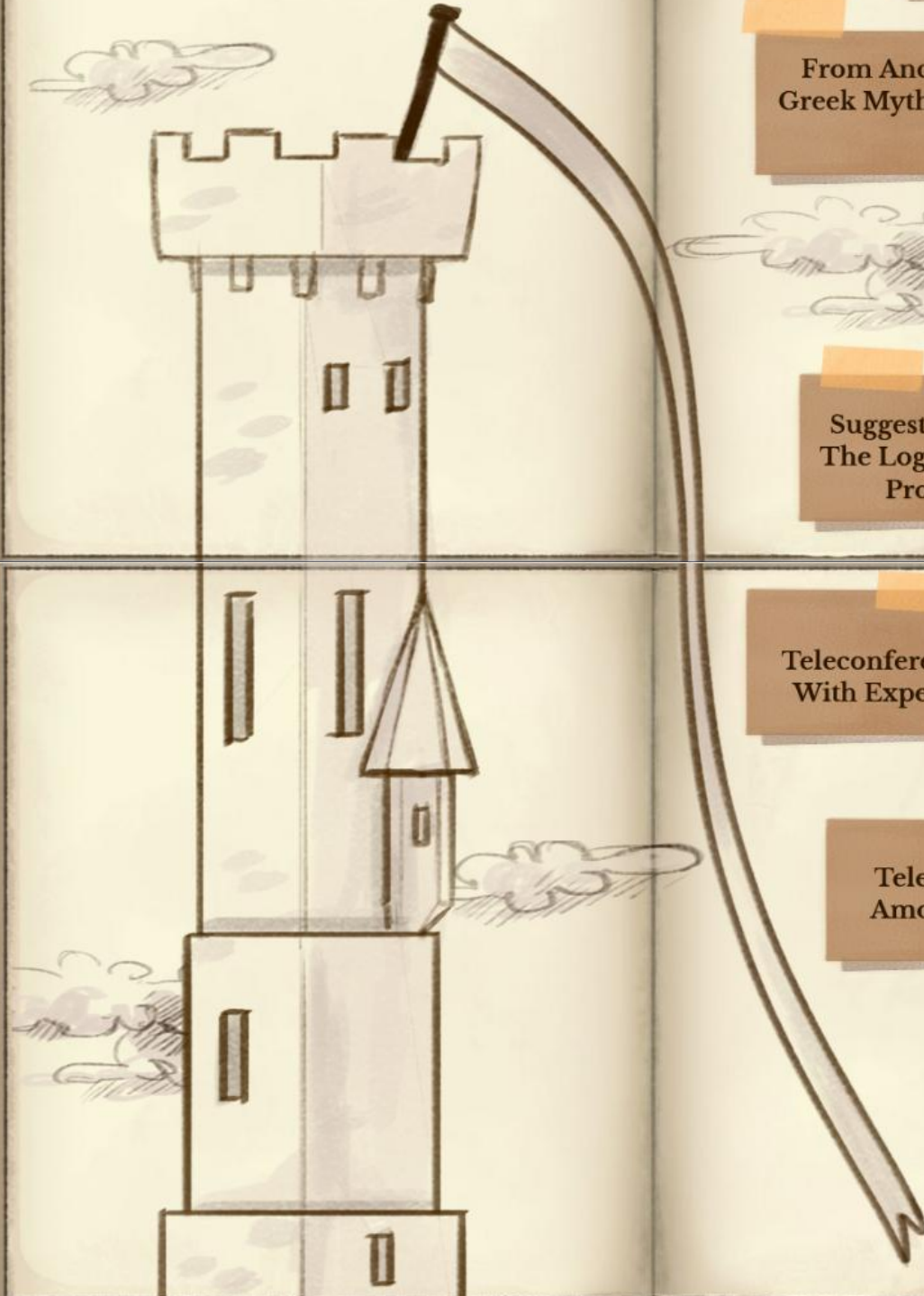

Comparison with the ancient heroes:

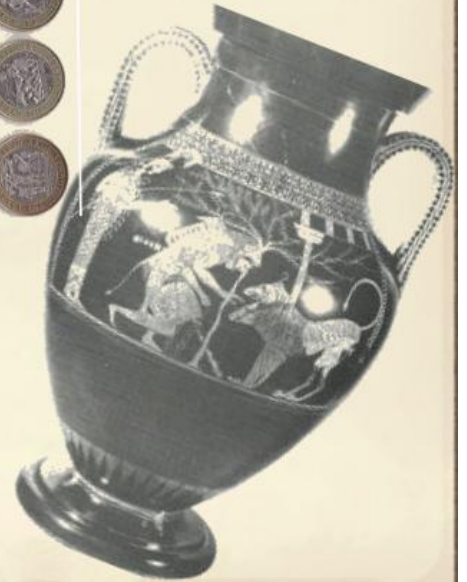
The students compared the characteristics of the modern heroes and the ancient ones. They found out that there weren't significant differences.

They studied the paintings of the Hercules' Labours on the ancient greek vases as well as on the modern coins.



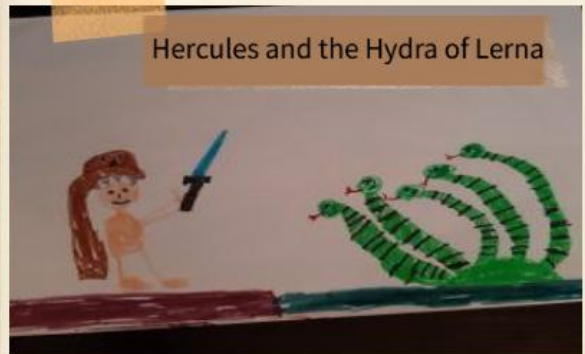

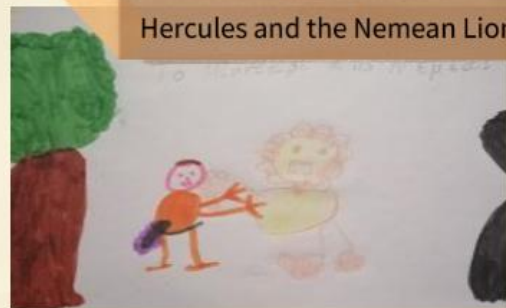
Hercules and the Stymphalian Birds

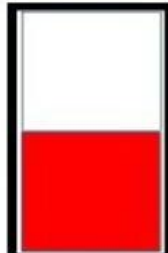
